Great Horkesley Parish Council

I hope everyone had a peaceful and pleasant Christmas and New Year! By the time this edition goes out we should have a new Booking Manager in place at the Village Hall.

We do have minimal availability for new regular hirers midweek, so if you are interested in hiring the hall please do contact the Booking Manager on the details above. This week has seen a sharp increase in hire requests for parties so don't leave it too late to book if you are hoping to use the hall for your event. Please remember that the period for which you hire the hall for must include any time you require for setting up and packing away. Hire rates will also be increasing slightly from 1st April - full details can be found on the website.

It was great to see so many people attend the light switch on for the first Village Christmas Tree in December, and I hope this is something that will continue for future years as the first event was so successful. We are still waiting for a date to meet with Colchester City Council to discuss the possibility of the Parish Council taking on ownership of the Village Green. This would hopefully mean more community events could take place on the green and it would also enable the Parish Council to have control over the installation of additional facilities and play equipment and ensure grass cutting takes place more regularly in summer months, but as with everything it would also mean increased costs. There is a lot to discuss, and it is taking some time to get the ball rolling!

Another issue that is taking time to resolve is the dangerous stretch of the A134 between Great Horkesley and Chesterwell. Councillors are very frustrated that more than a year has now passed since Cllr Cunningham agreed to authorise the introduction of a 40mph speed limit and we are continuing to chase for progress. Another highways issue that is brought to my attention regularly is parking. During school drop off and pick up times, please could everyone refrain from parking on any double yellow lines, zig zags, junctions, or opposite bus stops - even if you are only going to be a couple of minutes! On numerous occasions the roads have been blocked due to people parking inappropriately along the bus route, and I have also been told of near misses where adults, and young children, have almost been hit due to inconsiderate and dangerous parking. Keelers Way is another road prone to parking issues and it would be appreciated if people visiting the dentist as well as those that live on the road could ensure that they park sensibly.

Over the last couple of weeks, I have been in the process of drawing up the draft budget for 2025/26 for the Parish Council. This will be discussed at length by the Finance Committee next week and then will be taken to full council for approval, so that the precept figure can be sent to the City Council before the end of January.

At the last meeting of 2024 we welcomed back Caroline Wescomb-Cross as a coopted member, and she is hoping to get things moving with the Neighbourhood Plan again. The Chairman and a couple of other members recently met with representatives from Bloor Homes to discuss their plans to build 160 new houses on land north of Coach Road. It was made clear that the Parish Council do not support their proposed development on that site.

Great Horkesley Parish Council Chairman's Report

It's difficult to know where to start because suddenly there is mass of governmentdriven change coming at us. I shall concentrate on the one that will have the most impact on Great Horkesley: development.

The story so far: every planning authority (Colchester Council in our case) is supposed to have an adopted Local Plan which sets out, among other things, how it is going to meet its housing targets for the next 15 years. Colchester's target was 920 per year but that has been upped to 1300 by the new government. The Plan has to be reviewed every 5 years in a process that involves two public consultations and a public inquiry. Colchester's Local Plan runs until 2033 and the first 5-year review was well under way when the new target was set, so it is that review which be used to tackle the new 380-dwelling deficit. Last winter landowners across Colchester offered a number of large sites for development, including the one north of Coach Road on which Bloor has an option – more on this below. Colchester's planning officers have been out to inspect them all and in a report to their Local Plan Committee on 17th February will recommend some of those new sites for development. An indication of how controversial this will be is the venue for the meeting: Charter Hall (you can watch it online).

The Committee may add and remove sites as it chooses but the outcome of the meeting should be the publication of the new draft Local Plan for consultation. It will undoubtedly identify at least one site in Great Horkesley but there will also be policies designed to protect certain areas of the village from development; retaining the "green wedge" that still, just, separates the village from Chesterwell would be an example of this.

I strongly advise residents to engage with this process. I'll stick my neck out and say – as I have always said about housing development – some of it has got to go somewhere in the village, so don't just tell Colchester Council to stick it somewhere else. I shall recommend to my fellow parish councillors that we try to get the best we can out of this process whilst putting forward cogent arguments against anything we consider harmful. We must be constructive to be heard.

The results of the consultation will be digested by the planners and presented back to Colchester members in the summer with a view to the second consultation taking place in August and September; the inquiry should follow starting in late October. When I was a Colchester member I stood against consultations in holiday periods but this time there's an overriding need: if Colchester Council doesn't adopt the new Plan by February 2026, landowners are likely to take advantage of the government's new planning process by putting in speculative applications on the basis that Colchester hasn't shown how that 380-house deficit will be met.

Mention of speculative applications bring me to Bloor's proposals for the land north of Coach Road which were exhibited in the new village hall (see application 242010 on the CCC website). When parish councillors met a team from Bloor we repeated the argument you can find online, namely that by offering the land last winter when Colchester Council called for sites, they were engaging in a process which would enable the best site for the village to go forward. By then jumping the gun with a planning application for their site before that process was complete, weren't they admitting that it wasn't the best site?

Great Horkesley Parish Council Chairman's Report

This prompted the admission that the decision to put in a planning application had not been made and would not be made until the draft Local Plan had been released for consultation. So we wait.

I have been asked how the 100-dwelling development on the land around Great Horkesley Manor fits into this. The answer is that it doesn't. Colchester has already given an outline consent for that, so it counts against the existing 920 target. Again, we wait, this time for a developer to apply for reserved matters consent, setting out the detail that was absent from the outline application.

I have also been asked about the village's Neighbourhood Plan, on which a team of residents made a start and collected some very useful data on housing need. Sadly it is some months since progress has been made so I'm very pleased to say that a resident has come forward to take over leadership of that team with a view to getting our Plan in place at the same time as the new Local Plan. That is a tall order. Look out for, and please respond to, yet more consultation – the more people get involved, the stronger the Neighbourhood Plan becomes – and eventually a village referendum.

Challenging the Climate Emergency

In 2019, the City Council declared a climate emergency. Recently, the Scrutiny Committee, chaired by Councillor Darius Laws, reviewed the Council's progress.

The Scrutiny Panel acknowledged several commendable efforts, including tree planting, the development of safe cycling routes, and initiatives to reduce the Council's environmental impact. However, the panel identified significant financial and technological challenges. Retrofitting the Council's housing stock and estate comes with considerable costs, and advancing electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure faces technological limitations that require substantial investment—similar to challenges in the domestic car industry.

Scrutiny Panel Findings and Recommendations

The Scrutiny Panel noted that the term "emergency" implies an urgent need for action, but the Council risks failing to meet its self-imposed climate objectives without substantial capital funding for carbon reduction initiatives. The panel made the following recommendations:

1. **Definition of the Climate Emergency**

The Council must reassess whether it can achieve its declared objectives within current financial constraints.

2. **Recommendation to Cabinet**

Should the Cabinet find it impossible to meet the Council's Climate Emergency objectives, it should seek guidance from the Full Council. This may involve determining whether the situation qualifies as an "emergency" or whether the focus should shift to managing opportunities for carbon reduction and environmental improvements within existing budgets and business plans.

Wheelie Bins for All

The City of Colchester Council plans to introduce wheelie bins for all properties, where practical, with implementation expected in 2026. This initiative will likely include co-mingling for recycling—the practice of placing multiple waste types in a single bin.

Local Government Reform

Significant changes to local government are anticipated, including the consolidation of district and county councils. This reform aims to reduce administrative costs and minimize the number of part-time politicians. While details remain unclear, any initiative that saves taxpayers money and improves decision-making efficiency should be welcomed.





We were thrilled to host our second event of 2024 in December, the Great Horkesley Christmas Lights and Carols, and delighted so many of you could join us. The event built on the Church's annual carols and hot chocolate on the village green, and we hope you enjoyed getting together to celebrate the start of Christmas in the village. I do want to thank the GHCE team - as a group of volunteers we all have day jobs, children and busy lives of our own, but the joy for us comes when the village is together, and in creating that sense of community, which makes all the hard work worthwhile.

Our thanks for the event go to the Great Horkesley Parish Council, for the village's first ever Christmas tree - well done to Jack in particular for making this one happen. We must also thank Seasonal Flower Farm, Luxury by Lily, Goat in a Soap, the Braiswick Girlguiding Rangers, the Great Horkesley Scouts, Moley's Drinks Van, The Mobile Pizza Co and of course the WI and the Church for the mince pies and hot chocolate.





I will give the team a few weeks off (!) and then our attention will turn to the 2025 Summer Fayre, which we are hoping will be even bigger and better than 2024!






Great and Little Horkesley WI

Some seasonal thoughts from Rev'd. Anne Mason, Associate Priest

The shortest day in 2024 was 21st December and since then the days have been getting longer and we'll get more daylight each day until we reach the longest day in June. During these sometimes gloomy months bulbs that start flowering early, such as snowdrops, crocus and hyacinths, grow away in the dark, pushing their way through the cold soil, until they reach the light and give us the joy of seeing their flowers.

The sun gives us light and warmth for free, but often in the winter we have to rely on electric lights and central heating and may be worrying about the increased costs. A good way to keep warm and reduce loneliness is to meet up with others — invite a neighbour or friend round or go along to a café for a hot drink and a chat. Mental health studies have shown that it is good for us to be connected with other people. And faith is good for us too — some MRI scan results indicate that in terms of brain function, talking to God resembles conversing with a friend.

Thinking of light, I'm reminded of an amazing and thought-provoking painting of Jesus by artist Holman Hunt called 'The Light of the World', depicting Jesus standing outside a door and knocking to be let in. He is waiting in the dark with a lantern in his hand, but there is no door handle on the outside - the decision needs to be made by the person whose life and heart is being touched by Jesus. (You can see the painting in St Paul's cathedral.)

In the Bible we can read that Jesus said, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.' (John 8: v 12)

So, whether it's enjoying the early Spring flowers, having coffee with a friend, snuggling up in the warmth of your own home with a good book or TV programme, or having a chat with God, I pray that you look forward to longer days as the sun shines higher in the sky, and also that you feel the constant warmth of Jesus' love in your life.



Through The Garden Gate



A happy New Year to everyone!

I had hoped to write about a spring garden, but I'm sitting here looking out on a garden which is white with frost, and an extremely low temperature showing 3 degrees celsius below freezing on the thermometer on the house wall. Very little movement in the way of plants except few pink flowers on a Chaenomeles shrub (Quince), which I grow in a container - I think it must be a particularly early flowering one. There is a winter flowering Clematis by the front door, and a small tree in the border, a hybrid Prunus, which flowers through the winter months. I think it's a tree that should be more widely planted as a street tree. Cheering for people through the long grey winter days we get.

The nicest thing about a cold winter days is seeing more wild birds coming to garden feeders. In a large nearby tree nearby I often see the Tree Creeper on the stout branches, and also a pair of Great Spotted Woodpeckers. My latest visitors - a Nuthatch and the Grey Wagtail - birds I have always hoped to see here. So that was a nice surprise. The Grey Wagtail usually seen near water. Our little pond is covered, but the Wagtail is finding water in the birdbath and any old upturned lid which holds a little water.

I must soon venture out to do a bit of trimming, but I'm not a very good cold weather gardener so will wait until it is a little less chilly! One wonders what's in store for us in this new year of 2025. Hopefully not too wet and not too hot - but that seems a big ask in recent years. So fingers crossed.

In the meantime my mind turns to the succulent plants I have sheltering in the potting shed. It isn't entirely frost proof, but most of the less hardy plants come through in pretty



good condition considering it is an unheated place. It's a pleasant reminder of warmer lands when I walk in there. There are a few succulents I grow which are just hardy enough to sit the out through winter outside on the patio.

Mostly Sedums, so very attractive to butterflies during the summer months. Last summer I had a pair of the beautiful little Small Copper butterflies on the Sedums every day from morning, as soon as the temperature high enough, until the sun passed over late afternoon.

Sedums attract other butterflies too. It's worth checking which Sedums are worth buying if interested in wildlife. It's a rewarding hobby to know you are helping biodiversity. The garden nurseries are now offering lots of helpful plants. Take care everyone. Jill Plane, Great Horkesley



A Thank You to Sandy Comber Editor of Great Horkesley Village News 1989 - 2024

Many of you may know or recognise Sandy but maybe you didn't know that Sandy was, until last year, the editor of the Village News since its conception 1989! That is 35 years!

Sandy and her family, husband Bob, and their children Debra and Andrew, moved to Great Horkesley from London. At that time there



A group of new residents decided that we needed some fun events to bring the village together, and the first event was a Fun Run which became a regular annual event, and the "FUNraisers Committee" was born. Then followed the annual Village Show which also ran for many years. During these years, the "FUNraisers Committee" saw a need to provide residents with details of all village events, which included coach trips to see London's Christmas lights, the Annual Barn Dance and barbecue, visit to the Mary Rose exhibition, tickets to see several television programmes being recorded and many other fun events.

The first issue (just one sheet of A4 paper) of the Village News was in June 1989 and it is still delivered free throughout the village, from the A12 bridge up to and including all homes as far as All Saints' Church, and has been primarily self-funding, with small annual grants from the Parish Council during the last few years.

The Great Horkesley Village News grew considerably during these years, the size and content of the Village News has expanded with local businesses advertising their services. The Village News has received many awards for its presentation from the Essex Community Magazine, including Best New Entry, several Highly Commended and a MERIT award in 2014. Under her guidance, it's helped other associations to promote their events and it has brought villagers together. Her efforts via the Village News have been helped by the assistance of local volunteers in providing news and delivering the magazines. Her efforts and those of the volunteers, have helped to bring the Great Horkesley community closer together.

So, for all that she has done via the Village News she deserves our thanks and appreciation. The "FUNraisers Committee" became sadly depleted over the last few years, with only Sandy as Editor of the magazine, Mick Mead as the Treasurer and Jan Mead as Distribution Co-ordinator. All three remaining members of the original Committee deserve recognition of their commitment to the Village.

The new Editor and Treasurer is Caroline Evans, taking over from Issue 142 with Sam Jarvis as the new Distribution Co-ordinator.

The theme for our 4th Scarecrow Trail is **Family Films**.

The first thing you need to do is choose the film your scarecrow will represent. **Duplicate** scarecrows are not allowed, and scarecrows will be accepted on a first come first served basis, so if you have something in mind, please get your entry forms in early!

Is there a heroic character you idolise? Or could you recreate a famous scene from a family film out the front of your house? Maybe there's an animal in your favourite film that you would like to build as a scarecrow?! There are lots of possibilities...try and think outside the box!

Competition Rules

- The competition and trail starts at 9am on Saturday 24th May and runs until 4pm Sunday 1st June.
- Scarecrows need to be visible each day of the trail from 9am until 4pm.
- Scarecrows need to be maintained, as far as possible, in good condition for the duration of the trail.
- The organisers will provide a laminated A4 poster which must be displayed with the scarecrow. If, for some reason, the scarecrow is not available during the trail week the poster must still be displayed for trail followers to see so they can complete the trail.
- The organisers will take photographs of all the registered scarecrows during the first day. Registration of a scarecrow permits the Friends of Bishop William Ward School to use the photos of scarecrows on social media and in promotional literature/displays.
- Duplicate characters will NOT be allowed, and the acceptance of characters will be made on a first come first served basis. Confirmation of entry acceptance will be sent out as soon as possible by the organisers. Please do not begin making your scarecrow until you have received confirmation that your entry has been accepted!
- If the organisers have to limit the number of scarecrows on the trail, priority will be given to early entrants. Some entrants may be asked to consider alternative locations for their scarecrows in order to maintain an accessible and reasonably spaced and balanced trail.
- Winning scarecrows will be decided by votes from members of the public who have purchased a trail map. If there is more than one category, scarecrows may only win one category and the organisers' decision is final. The makers of at least one winning scarecrow will receive a £50 cash prize. The organisers reserve the right to change the categories and prize monies to best fit the number of votes received during the trail week.
- The entry fee of £10 and completed entry forms must be returned to Bishop William Ward School no later than Friday 2nd May 2025. Late entries will not be accepted.

There will be a trail competition for all trail followers who have purchased a map. The winner of the trail competition will be drawn from all correct entries and will receive £50. The organisers' decision is final.

Competition Guidelines

- Above all the Scarecrow Trail is about having fun and we hope that you do!
- When making your scarecrow, think about the theme and the characteristics and/or situation that will make your choice of scarecrow instantly recognisable.
- Scarecrows can be made in the traditional format (i.e. based around a cross shaped frame and making use of straw), or as ANY kind of modern interpretation.
- Face masks, paper mâché and other materials may all be used but thought should be given to how these will stand up to the elements throughout the duration of the Scarecrow Trail.
- It is recommended that scarecrows in the front garden of private houses are set back
 from their front boundary fences to minimise the risk of vandalism. Commercial premises
 may wish to display their scarecrow either standing or seated outside during the hours
 they are open, and in their windows whilst they are closed. When making the scarecrow,
 take into consideration how easy it will be to move it, if required.
- Scarecrows can be standing, seated, lying down however best suited to their character.
- Consider making a "storyboard" of the construction of your scarecrow to display alongside for trail followers to look at.
- Further information will be sent out to all accepted entrants before the trail week.



With the short days and dark nights, 1st Great Horkesley Scout Group is looking ahead and planning camps for when the warmer weather arrives – but still having plenty of fun in the meantime too!

The group had an enjoyable run-up to Christmas, including singing carols in the city centre to raise funds for the Cubs' chosen charity, the Colchester Community First Responders – two of whom even joined us for the evening. The Cubs are raising money to part-fund a second defibrillator for the north end of the village. We also had our traditional Christmas Sing-a-long at All Saints Church, including our special rousing interactive rendition of the Twelve Days of Christmas. 

Easter Egg Brownies

Ingredients

- 5 creme eggs
- 175g/Goz dark chocolate, broken into small pieces.
- 175g/Goz unsalted butter, plus extra for greasing
- 2 +bsp cocoa powder
- 3 large free-range eggs
- 150g/5½0z caster sugar

- 150g/5½oz light brown sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla bean paste / vanilla extract
- 115g/40z plain flour
- 1/2 tsp fine sea salt
- 150g/5½0z shortbread biscuits, roughly chopped (optional however they add structure to the batter to help the creme eggs stay in place when cooking)

Method

- 1. Place the chocolate eggs in the freezer. (This will make them easier to cut cleanly and means they won't melt too much in the oven.) Grease and line a square 20cm/8in cake tin. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4 (kids please ask an adult to help you with this).
- 2. Place the chocolate, butter and cocoa powder in a heatproof glass bowl and set it over a saucepan of gently simmering water, making sure the water does not touch the bowl. Stir until completely melted and then remove from the heat. In a separate bowl, whisk together the eggs, caster sugar, light brown sugar and vanilla until smooth. Pour into the chocolate mixture and mix well. Add in the flour and salt and mix until smooth. Stir in the shortbread biscuits (optional). Pour the mixture into the prepared tin.
- 3. Take the chocolate eggs out of the freezer and slice them in half vertically. Nestle them into the brownie mixture, with the insides of the eggs facing up, and bake for 27–30 minutes until just set. Remove from the oven and leave to cool completely before slicing into squares.






Mission to Hungary & Ukraine

for over 30 years and learnt a lot about what to do and what not to do! Paul spoke at their church, and I taught at a Women's Weekend Conference which was held in a hotel just outside Budapest in the countryside. It was a beautiful location for the ladies to spend time enjoying a rest, worshipping Jesus, and time for prayer and good food.







destination, Kremenchuk in the East. When the bus arrived in this city, the family greeting us pointed out the hoarding where we had alighted. It was where the shopping centre once stood before a missile razed it to the ground killing many.

We stayed with a pastor and his family who we have been supporting since the start of the war.





There has been an explosion of interest in finding out about Christianity amidst

the fear, devastation and loss in their lives. It was a privilege to spend time with so many, young and old struggling in the midst of war. Many were afraid for their husbands, sons and young men and women on the frontline. Others were struggling to work having lost their businesses and jobs and fled their homes in the east.



I had no idea before we went how relevant

our story would be to the people of Ukraine. One of violent death of a loved one, losing all you worked for and your home. The vulnerability and sense of helplessness.

The trauma of loss. The sense of injustice.

Some 35 years ago I cried out to God (who I didn't really believe in) when my 18-year-old sister died in a road traffic accident. I experienced his peace. I chose to find out more about him. Later on, we lost our home, our money, it was unjust. Yet Jesus brought us through.

We visited a refugee family in a village. They had lost everything. The dad was working from 4am until 10pm on a farm with a break from 9-12 noon. It was hard, unfamiliar work. They were renting a 2-room bungalow. We were able to say with credibility that we understood what it was like, having lost everything many years ago and starting again. That with Jesus he can bring us through the deep valleys in life. That we don't have to get stuck in the valley, he can lead us

through.

Not only that, we are also better for it. We learnt that Jesus is trustworthy, and our experience changed our hearts and attitudes.

We visited wounded soldiers in hospital. In preparation for this, we spent several hours making up packs to give them as the basics are not provided for there. Each pack contained a bar of soap, a toothbrush & paste,

razor, chocolate bars, socks and a copy of the New Testament. Our visit moved me to tears. It was their eyes. They were full of sadness, hopelessness, fear and brokenness. We were able to shake their hand and pray with them. They were so, so thankful to have visitors as they were far from home and loved ones.





We were able to bring them hope, love and peace in Jesus. As we left a nurse commented to the pastor "I knew you had been because I can see the men are so happy."

We taught a large group of refugees about Jesus; we spoke at their church where many were moved to tears and gave their lives to Jesus. We recorded teachings for them to listen to after we left. We parted with hugs and tears. It had been a very full time. It was an exhausting 2-day journey back to Hungary from where we flew home.

These verses in the bible had come alive.

What a wonderful God we have—he is the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the source of every mercy, and the one who so wonderfully comforts and strengthens us in our hardships and trials. And why does he do this? So that when others are troubled, needing our sympathy and encouragement, we can pass on to them this same help and comfort God has given us. 2 Corinthians 1:4-7

It was originally formed as a wind band at the Methodist Chapel to play 'To the glory of God' and to that extent we still do as we have a commitment to play for special services at other churches by request even though Boxted Chapel is closed. We had a successful but very busy December with carol services in Boxted, Polstead and Wimpole Road Methodist church, carols and festive music at the Boxted tree lighting afternoon, playing at Mersea and Long Melford Christmas events as well as playing carols around Boxted at outdoor carols in Nayland and Stoke by Nayland, outside supermarkets and our usual mad dash around on Christmas Eve playing at individual houses across the area. We raised £2,690.70 which will be shared between the Band and Emmaus Colchester.

The New Year Honours list included a British Empire Medal awarded to John Polley a loyal member of Band for eighty years plus. We are really pleased for him and it is a well-deserved award.

Looking ahead to 2025 we have several events already booked – concerts in Weeley and Holland on Sea, Rowhedge Regatta and a special celebration service at All Saints Shrub End church and a local spring concert in Boxted. We hope to have a spot on Colchester Park bandstand this year too.

We play a wide range of music from traditional brass band repertoire, through jazz and film music, shows and orchestral arrangements so there is something to suit everyone. 
