Most of my time in recent weeks has been spent preparing the Parish Council's accounts for audit. The internal audit has now been completed, and the auditor was very positive, so now everything has been sent to the external auditor. The notice for the period of public rights has begun and hopefully the annual audit process for 2024-25 will be completed in early August.

The Council have been making good progress with taking on ownership of the Jubilee Green and are aiming for a handover date of 1st December. Solicitors have been engaged and are starting to work on the copious amounts of admin entailed. This should mean that come next year, the Parish Council will hopefully be in control of more regular grass cutting, improvements to the play area and facilities on the green, and also hire charges for the open space; the summer fayre organised by a group of volunteer residents currently have to pay hundreds of pounds to the City Council to hire the green for the free community event, and this is something that councillors wish to address.

Councillors are also continuing to push for the speed limit change on the A134. It is incredibly frustrating that this was agreed circa 18 months ago, yet still the action has not been taken to change it. Cllr Lewis Barber is helping with this, and we really hope for a positive update soon.

I have received complaints from both parish councillors and residents regarding the EV bikes that are left carelessly around the village, and particularly along the A134 as a few near misses have occurred when people (especially schoolchildren) swerve into the road to avoid them. I have put in a complaint with those responsible for the bikes, but it would help enormously if everyone could please leave the bikes sensibly and safely once they have been used.

As yet, we have no update on a decision on the outline planning application for the land north of Coach Road (Planning Application 250545), although this may have changed by the time this edition of the Village News reaches you. The next actions of the Parish Council very much depend on the outcome of the application, so we wait to hear whether it is approved or rejected.

Village Hall bookings are starting to pick up over the summer months, and we have recently taken on three new regular hirers during the week - please take a look at the updated list of regular hirers elsewhere in this magazine.

Someone has recently taken the water bowl that was left by the drinking fountain for dogs to use – please could you return it as soon as possible as this is used regularly by local dog walkers. We do have CCTV covering the area.

There are a few improvements planned for the hall. In July, the three external doors in the main hall are being replaced, as they are not fit for purpose. The Village Hall Committee are also looking into increasing the number of solar panels on the hall roof, and installing air conditioning, as they know the temperature in the hall rises rapidly in the summer months.

Residents are always welcome to attend council meetings to raise any matters regarding the Village, but please respect those who give up their own time and energy for free to listen to your concerns and fulfil their role of councillor. We had an instance recently where derogatory remarks were made by a resident as they left the meeting, and this will not be tolerated.

It is much quicker if you contact the City Council or Essex Highways directly for complaints or reports of potholes, missed bin collections, fly tipping and graffiti — contact details can be found on page 70. If you need to contact the Parish Clerk about any other matters then please email me in the first instance as this will receive the quickest response, thank you. Councils tend to take a step back over the summer months, and we don't have an August meeting, so I will also be taking some annual leave and therefore please be aware that I will not be able to reply immediately over the next six weeks. Wishing everyone a fantastic summer break!

New Signage for Coach Road/Nayland Road/London Road Junction: County Cllr Lewis Barber has persuaded the Local Highways Panel to fund better signage at this junction to hopefully reduce accidents. Will this be enough to reduce incidents at this spot or would other measures be useful. please do let us know?

Speeding on the A134 (Chesterwell – Great Horkesley): The team recently met with Essex Highways to demand progress on lowering the speed limit on the A134 between Great Horkesley and Chesterwell. Despite public support for a reduction in the 60 mph speed limit, and a positive indication from Essex County Council's Cabinet Member for Highways, formal progress had stalled for far too long. County Councillor Lewis Barber said, "Highways Officers expressed a surprising concern that reducing the speed limit might encourage higher speeds, an argument we challenged robustly. We made clear the urgent need for this change, particularly given the increased number of pedestrians, including children walking to school". Following our intervention, Highways have now accepted the case and agreed to move forward with the formal decision.

Housing in Great Horkesley: Colchester's plan for development drastically increases the council's high housing targets. Colchester City Council (CCC) released information on locations for thousands of new homes within the next 15 years. Colchester's draft Local Plan sharply increases the council's high house-building target, implementing the Labour government's strategy of moving housing from cities to the countryside. The impact of these proposals on the local countryside and some villages will be significant - with 413 new homes allocated to Great Horkesley alone (ref. PP34 & PP35), Cllr. William Sunnucks, has conducted a "deep dive" into planning at Colchester Council and is pressing for an infrastructure first approach to development. Cllr. William Sunnucks said, "There is still no proper infrastructure planning in Colchester Council's Local Plan. The new plan allocates land for a 26% increase in the housing stock, and thus a 26% increase in population. But there is no planning for a proportionate investment in roads, public transport, GP surgeries, sewage systems or hospitals". Following pressure from Conservative Councillors and residents, at a meeting in May, Colchester Council's Local Plan Committee voted to postpone the scheduled Local Plan consultation for a second time to allow more time for infrastructure concerns to be addressed, "Colchester is already one of the fastest growing areas in the country. We cannot support further house-building at the scale proposed unless expanded facilities are planned in proportion. If nothing is done, residents will suffer ongoing traffic congestion and won't be able to get a GP appointment. The hospital will be full, sewage will flood into the rivers and the supply of water will be short", added Cllr. Sunnucks.

Fly-tipping: Sadly we have seen a rise in the number of fly-tipping incidents. The City Council will do their best to keep on top of this but if you do spot any the quickest way of it being dealt with is by logging it via the colchester.gov.uk website. Flooding: A resolution to the long running flooding issues on Old House Road is a step closer. Trial hole works will be conducted in July to determine the drainage arrangements and the work required to tackle the problem. This follows our successful work with stakeholders in reducing the flooding and road damage on London Road, near School Lane. Cllr. Lewis Barber said, "We will continue to work to resolve other flooding issues, including on London Road and under the A12 bridge, near Chesterwell. In the latter case, although works have taken place, additional action is needed to resolve the flooding issue permanently". "We also attended an event hosted by Anglian Water, at which various organisations met to discuss and resolve issues that come under the responsibility of multiple agencies", added Cllr. Barber. Please do get in touch if there are any flooding issues in your area that you would like us to investigate.

Pylons (from Sir Bernard Jenkin MP): Recently, I led a Westminster Hall debate on the delivery of National Grid Upgrades, As you are probably aware. National Grid is proposing to build a new line of electricity pylons, running 112 miles from Norwich to Tilbury, to transmit electricity from offshore windfarms to London. The electricity cables will be carried on 50-metre-high pylons and run close to villages including Langham. Great Horkesley, Fordham and Great Tey and includes provision for a large substation located near Ardleigh, During the debate, I warned the Energy Minister that: 1. The Norwich to Tilbury [Pylons] project would be delayed by public opposition and legal challenges. 2. Underground High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) cables would therefore be cheaper and faster, because they carry public consent. Relying on new lines of pylons for the entire upgrade will delay decarbonising the national grid because they arouse such hostility and will end up costing more because of those delays. The National Energy System Operator's (NESO) recently reported that Norwich to Tilbury will now be delayed at least one year, costing an extra £4bn for each year of delay. It is becoming increasingly clear that undergrounding HVDC is the way forward for the great national grid upgrade. Undergrounding will carry public consent and avoid delays - and will therefore be cheaper as well as better for the countryside.

Cllr. Darius Laws has issued a strong objection to the proposed pylons route, which runs close to Great Horkesley and areas bordering the Dedham Vale National Landscape


Local Government Reform: Essex has been included in the Government's priority programme for Local Government Reorganisation and Devolution. This will see all 15 principal councils in Essex abolished (including Essex County and Colchester City) and replaced by an expected 2-5 Unitary Authorities (Parish & Town Councils are not expected to be affected). Shadow elections for the new Unitary Authorities are expected to take place in May 2027. A new directly elected Mayor for Essex will also be introduced at an election due to take place in May 2026. The Mayor will have new powers from Government, which are expected to include public transport and strategic planning. The Essex County Council Elections scheduled to take place in May 2025 were postponed as part of the re-organisation process.

Great Horkesley Parish Council Chairman's Report

The Parish Council is currently blessed with a full slate of nine members, so we've been able to tackle more issues by setting up committees that can hold short, daytime meetings. My report this time is about some of those issues and what we're hoping to achieve for the village. "Our" village green has never been ours: it still belongs to Colchester Council because when the time came for Mersea Homes to hand it over as the Tile House Farm development neared completion, Colchester Council had just severely reduced the grant it paid to all parish councils. Faced with a loss of several thousand pounds from its annual budget, the parish council of the day decided it could not take on the running costs of the new village green, so by default Colchester Council took possession. Aware of dissatisfaction among residents about how the green is managed, the current parish council is now negotiating to take possession. We hope that local management will eventually mean speedier repairs to playground equipment, grass that gets cut when it needs cutting - especially where football training takes place - and grant-aided introduction of facilities on the green that residents have already told us would be welcome, such as outdoor gym equipment and a perimeter path that is wheelchair-friendly. This will come at a price. The increased annual cost to residents will be partly offset by more houses in the village (the Hopkins Homes development around the Manor does have a silver lining) and we've identified a potential saving on the village hall budget; we currently pay about £5k annually for electricity which we believe we could substantially reduce by increasing the number of solar panels and installing batteries. There should be grants to help with the capital cost of new equipment, a source of funds the GHPC village hall committee is hoping will also offset the cost of airconditioning for the main hall. Tiresomely, the new doors agreed for the main hall won't be eligible grant – "wear-and-tear" never is – but our budget reserves will take the strain. On the subject of new homes, the parish council has resolved to take over the creation of a Neighbourhood Plan for Great Horkesley from the resident group that started it. We've met planners from Colchester Council who seem just as keen as we are to salvage the data collected in the Housing Needs survey, give it legitimacy as part of an adopted Plan and then use it as leverage to influence the housing mix offered by future developers. It should also help to identify what existing residents believe would make Great Horkesley "an even better place to live". What it won't do is identify alternatives to the 400-home Coach Road site that the planners are trying to get Colchester councillors to agree to: that sort of Plan would take far too long to complete and couldn't be ready before Colchester's new Local Plan comes into force. Look out for another Resident Survey, a crucial part of forming a Neighbourhood Plan, and do respond if you possibly can. 22% of village households took part in the Housing Needs survey: it was enough but the more people who respond, the more authoritative the finished Plan becomes. This is a classic case of "help us to help you", so please don't leave it to your neighbour because, chances are, they're leaving it to you.

Finally, those perennial A134 issues, the speed limit and the surface water. That extraordinarily hard-working County Councillor Lewis Barber has reported that Essex Highways have finally agreed to start the legal process that should lead to a 40mph limit on the road between the village and Chesterwell, a mere 18 months after the responsible ECC Cabinet Members told them to do it. He has also learned that the excavations in the early spring have discovered the origin of the surface water – hence the irregular dashed white line on the northbound carriageway – and the remedial work has been put out to tender. I'm not holding my breath.

The resolution called for a "sufficient supply of convenient and sanitary houses, being of vital importance to women in the country". The Women's Institute is democratic and member-led, and the Resolutions process is unique in putting members at the heart of decisions about campaign activities. Every issue that the W I campaign on stems directly from a resolution put forward by members and adopted at the Annual Meeting. A resolution is a call for change on a current issue in society. Past resolutions have included, Increase in women police, Equal pay, Keep Britain Tidy, Restriction of smoking in public place, Plastic Pollution, HIV and AIDs awareness and also Recruiting midwives. 

WI Campaign Report Highlights that the Dental Health Crisis Hits Women Hardest Our latest campaign report highlights that a lack of access to NHS dental care is hitting women the hardest and deepening a uniquely gendered health crisis. Research from our members is the first of its kind to highlight that a lack of NHS dental services is having devastating, but also gendered, consequences on society. Women are often the designated primary caregivers for their families and are therefore navigating the dental health service as carers, often sacrificing their own health in order to support their loved ones. Women also have unique oral health challenges compared to men, with their saliva being more acidic and more prone to dental decay, as well as hormonal changes such as pregnancy and menopause increasing women's susceptibility to gum disease. In support of the campaign and its report - which carries the lived experiences of hundreds of women - British Dental Association Chair, Eddie Crouch, added: "The crisis in NHS dentistry is having a unique impact on women up and down the country. From pregnancy to menopause, as parents and as carers, access problems often hit women hardest. This service can have a future, but only if ministers are willing to pick up the pace and keep their promises. Until then, patients — especially women — will continue to pay the price." Rev. Heather Wilcox writes:

The Taste of Summer!

Popping into the supermarkets at this time of the year, we are often met by signs which say something along the lines of 'The taste of summer', which have all been hung strategically in aisles full of foods suitable for picnics on the beach and BBQs in our gardens, outdoor, social gatherings with friends and family.

So, what is the taste of summer? I guess it's fresh salads, ice cream, BBQ with the hint of charcoal as an added extra, all washed down with our favourite ice-cold drinks. These are the foods that the supermarkets hope will evoke the image of long hot summer days. I'm picking vegetables from my garden; you can't get any fresher than that. The cucumbers, courgettes and raspberries have been joined by peas, runner beans, tomatoes, sweetcorn, chillies and, eventually in the autumn, pumpkins. That is the taste of summer to me, fresh produce straight from the garden and onto our plates.

In psalm 34.8 the psalmist invites us to 'Taste and see that the Lord is good', inviting us to experience God's goodness personally. To taste involves testing or sampling; to see involves understanding or perceiving. The phrase 'Taste and see', then means 'try and experience'. The writer is urging God's people to discover the goodness of the Lord by personal trial and experience it for themselves. He doesn't want readers to merely take his word for it that the Lord is good; he wants them to actively experience and know for themselves that the Lord is good.

So, as we experience the 'Taste of summer' may we also 'Taste and see that the Lord is good'. May we make time to try and experience that goodness that God, that Jesus offers us, this summertime and always.







Apple & Rhubarb Crumble

Ingredients (Filling):

- 600g/11b 50z Eating/Cooking Apples (chopped)
- 400g/14oz Rhubarb (chopped)
- 1+bsp Lemon Juice
- Caster Sugar (see method for amount)

Ingredients (Topping):

- 1759/602 Plain Flour
- 1/2 tsp Cinnamon
- 100g/30z Butter (room temp & diced)
- 125g/40z Caster Sugar or Light Soft Brown Sugar

To make the filling:

- Put the applés in a large saucepan with the lemon juice and 4 tbsp of water. Stir
 in the caster sugar (using 75g/2¾oz for eating apples or 95g/3¼oz for cooking
 apples).
- 2. Cover with a lid, cook for 5 minutes on medium heat, stirring occasionally, until syrupy and softening. Take off the heat, stir in the rhubarb and tip the mixture into a wide 2 litre/3½ pint baking dish.
- 3. Preheat the oven to 190C/170C Fan/Gas 5.

To make the topping:

1. Place the flour, cinnamon, butter and sugar in a large bowl. Rub together with your fingertips until rough & crumbly. Scatter over the top of the fruit, then sprinkle with 1 tbsp of sugar.

Bake the crumble for 35–40 minutes until the top is golden and crisp and the fruit underneath is bubbling. Leave to cool for 10 minutes before serving.

Butternut Squash Soup

Ingredients:

- 2 tsps Sunflower Oil
- 2 Chopped Onions
- 2 Chopped Celery Sticks
- 1 2 Crushed Garlic Cloves (optional)
- 2 tsps Ground Corriander
- 2 tsps Ground Ginger
- 850ml / 1.5pts Vegetable Stock (150ml / 1/4 pt optional)
- Groud Black Pepper (to taste)
- 450g Butternut Squash Diced (peeled & seeded)

Method:

- 1. Heat oil in a large, non-stick saucepan. Add onions, celery and garlic (if using); cook over a medium-low heat for 5 minutes or until softened, stirring occasionally. Add ground spices; cook gently for 1 minute, stirring.
- 2. Stir in squash, stock and black pepper. Bring to the boil; reduce heat, cover and simmer for about 25 minutes or until vegetables are tender, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Remove from heat; cool slightly. Puree in a blender or food processor until smooth; return soup to rinsed-out pan. Add up to 150ml (1/4) pint) of extra stock if you prefer a thinner soup. Re-heat gently until hot, stirring occasionally.

Serve in warmed soup bowls with crusty bread.

To freeze: Allow to cool completely; transfer to a rigid, freezer-proof container. Cover, seal and label. Freeze for up to 3 months.



though, which brought a couple adrift from their wires. I have a shallow well here in the back garden. It's just about 15ft. deep. I've always used the water on my many containerised plants. Some years back it would never run out of water, but in the last 3 years, it's been out of water by August. This year it's already run dry in June! I'm not sure what this says about the water table. A worrying prospect for farmers I'd have thought. I like growing flowering plants in pots, but each year it's getting more of a struggle as the little containers turn into little ovens. Hydrangeas

are especially vulnerable, and perhaps it's more practical to plant them directly into the ground. The problem with that for me is, I can't control the colour of the flowers. I have a few I like to keep flowering blue. It's rare in hard water areas to have acid soil, which facilitates the blueing process with the aluminium. Fascinating plants in that their flower colours depend on the minerals in the soil. They flower pink when lime present, as lime blocks any blueing of the flowers. I'm only speaking of the Mophead and Lacecap varieties here. The white flowering ones are unaffected by this of course, but might show a little pink as the flower ages. Sometimes pink and blue flowers



appear on same shrub, as the roots reach different areas of the soil. A complicated bit of science going on. I'll sign off now, hoping for cooler weather tomorrow, Jill Plane
